Between September 7 and 10, 2017, Hurricane Irma devastated the East and North of Cuba. It's the first time a category 5 hurricane directly hits Cuba. With 300 km/h winds and torrential rains, the hurricane destroyed thousands of houses and public buildings, caused major flooding, severed communications, damaged roads, ruined crops and left thousands of Cubans homeless.

We are well acquainted with the determination and resilience of the Cuban people. We know they will rise to the task of rebuilding their country. Cubans have been through difficult times before, such as the Special Period in the '90s or the fight against the American embargo. BUT WE CAN AND MUST SUPPORT THEM IN THIS STRUGGLE FOR RECONSTRUCTION. Why? Cubans send more doctors to disaster zones around the world than the rest of the world combined. This poor country blockaded by the United States continues to be a selfless example of support and solidarity for people around the world in spite of great odds. They deserve our recognition and solidarity for their generous humanity.

A PRIVILEGED RELATIONSHIP WITH THE CUBAN PEOPLE

For decades now, CUPW has been maintaining a privileged relationship with the Cuban people. We send delegations to the May 1st celebrations and we encourage members to develop ties with our Sisters and Brothers from Cuba's national union of communications, computer and electronic workers (SNTCIE).

A year ago already, we launched a joint training project with the SNTCIE for postal workers in Camaguey and Ciego de Avila. These two regions were particularly hit hard by hurricane Irma.
